How to Get There

Getting to Aspen, Colorado

Aspen is about 200 miles southwest of Denver, Colorado.

If you're flying in, the closest airport is Aspen Pitkin County Airport (ASE), which is just a short, four-mile drive from downtown Aspen. Flights to Aspen come in from 10 cities around the US on United and American Airlines.

Alternatively, some travelers opt to fly into Vail Eagle County Airport (EGE), approximately 70 miles from downtown Aspen.

You can also fly into Denver International Airport (DEN) and then catch a connecting flight to Aspen or drive from Denver to Aspen. The drive from Denver to Aspen takes about 3.5 to 4 hours when the roads are dry. During the winter, the drive can be very unpredictable with the weather.

The Gant is one of my favorite properties in Aspen! You'll find one to four bedroom condominiums designed with full kitchens, living and dining rooms, wood-burning fireplaces, and patios or balconies. This property has complimentary transportation all around town and airport transfers. Two heated pools, three hot tubs, tennis and pickleball courts in the summertime. It's like home away from home!

The Crestwood

400 Wood Rd, Snowmass Village

The Crestwood condominiums are located in Snowmass just a short walk to Snowmass Base Village. You'll find one to four bedroom condos here with living rooms and full kitchens. Ski directly down from The Crestwood to the Village Express lift and Elk Camp gondola and directly back into The Crestwood after the ski day! This is an exception location in Snowmass.

Aspen Square Condominiums

617 E Cooper Ave, Aspen

This property is in downtown Aspen, just a short walk to the Silver Queen gondola. Aspen Square's condominiums are studios to four bedroom accommodations. Each of these condominiums have kitchens, wood-burning fireplaces, living areas and private balconies. They have a front desk, concierge, bell staff and daily housekeeping. Amenities include an outdoor heated pool and two hot tubs, and fitness center. Just a short walk to the Aspen Silver Queen gondola!

Ideal for families and outdoor enthusiasts, The Viewline Snowmass Resort offers comfortable rooms and suites with modern amenities. With ski-in/ski-out access, multiple dining options, a fitness center, and panoramic mountain views from its outdoor hot tub, guests can enjoy a relaxing mountain retreat. The Viewline Snowmass' location is it's best feature. Located directly on the mountain with the best ski (and hike) access around!



Winter Season

The ski season in Aspen Snowmass begins on Thanksgiving (or thereabouts depending on snowfall) and ends around April 15th (also, depending on snow conditions) Early season typically has unpredictable conditions as the weather is just starting to get cold.

During the Festive season (Christmas, Hanukkah, and New Year's) the snow can still be unpredictable. Lift ticket prices and hotel nightly rates are highest at this time due to the holidays.

Mid-January until the end of March has great snow in an average ski season.

Rates and availability will be highest during "holiday" times such as Festive, Martin Luther

King weekend in mid-January, President's week in mid-February, and Spring Break in March.

Value-dates are: early January after New Year's and April 1st through the closing.



Summer Season

The summer season in Aspen Snowmass begins Memorial Day weekend and goes until Labor Day weekend. Typically, the first weekend in June is when restaurants re-open if they closed for the off-season.

*check with your favorite restaurants if you're traveling to Aspen Snowmass at end of May or end of August to make sure they're open since these are "shoulder seasons".

When to Go, continued...

Spring Season

Spring in Aspen Snowmass is still ski season in April until about mid-month. The temperatures will rise, snow will become softer and it's a fun time to be in town! There is a fun energy around Aspen, outdoor music, outdoor dining and longer days. By the end of April, the ski resorts are closed and it is considered "mud season". This is when the snow is melting and the ground is starting to soften up.

Restaurants will either close mid-month or have limited hours and run some "locals specials".

April and May are not the most recommended time to be in Aspen Snowmass as the seasons are changing, the weather is unpredictable, and some of the shops, restaurants, and attractions close. (Not all of them close, but many do)

When to Go, continued

Fall Season

The fall season in Aspen Snowmass unofficially begins Labor Day weekend and ends towards the end of December. The aspen trees turn golden yellow and the temperatures start to drop. Many locals will tell you this is their favorite time of year! The beauty is abundant and the crowds are minimal – making it for a perfect time to be in the mountains.

<u>Pro Tip:</u> The second and third week in Sept are typically the very best for viewing the golden Aspen leaves!

And Jour de Fete is my favorite for coffee and a meal, as I love their food menu. They're also great for summer and outdoor seating!



Skiing and Enowboarding

The best part about skiing and Snowboarding in Aspen Snowmass is that there are four ski resorts on one lift ticket and each ski resort is very different from each other!


This makes it a perfect place to visit if you have skiers or snowboarders of different ages and levels. Or, if you're just learning and want the option to move up from one resort to the next as your skills improve.

Aspen Mountain

Aspen Mountain is located directly in downtown Aspen beautifully situated to overlook the town of Aspen.

Aspen Mountain is made up of all expert and intermediate trails. There aren't any beginner runs on this mountain. (nor is it very big!) It's recommended that beginner skiers and snowboarders start at Buttermilk or Snowmass Mountain.

Aspen is perfect for the experienced skier who wants to challenge themselves to some advanced terrain.



Aspen Highlands

Aspen Highlands is also considered to be an extremely challenging ski resort in the Aspen Snowmass collection of resorts. Comprised of intermediate blue runs, black and double black diamond runs, Aspen Highlands is very challenging. Aspen Highlands is the "local's" resort of the group, very popular among skiers who call Aspen home. "Hiking the bowl" is something you'll want to add to your list of to-do's if you're an expert skier and skiing Highlands. This entails hiking up to the Highlands Bowl and skiing down.





Skiing and Enowboarding, continued.

Buttermilk Ski Area

Buttermilk Ski Area is known as the beginner mountain in Aspen Snowmass. The trails at Buttermilk are 35% green beginner, 39% blue and 25% black diamond. It's an approachable, unintimidating place for kids or adults to learn to ski or snowboard. Buttermilk isn't a large ski resort, with only 470 skiable acres.

Snowmass Mountain

Snowmass Mountain is the largest ski resort of the four mountains at Aspen Snowmass. (by far!) Snowmass has 3,339 skiable acres and is perfect for the intermediate skier. These ski runs are family friendly, wide open and never crowded, making it a perfect ski resort to improve your skills. Snowmass Mountain also has a few terrain parks to learn tricks!

IKON PASS

The IKON Pass is a season pass that allow access to a wide selection of ski resorts! Included in the IKON Pass are 7 days at Aspen Snowmass. This means, if you're an full IKON Pass holder, you can use your pass at any of the four Aspen Snowmass ski resorts for 7 days.



For the non-skiers

Aspen Snowmass is a great destination for those who aren't skiing or snowboarding! There's plenty to do, whether you want to be active or less-active. Here are my recommendations for a fun-filled day off the slopes.

Snowmobiling

Snowmobiling through White River National Forest with <u>T-Lazy-7 Ranch</u> is an adventurous option for anyone who wants to do something active and exciting off the slopes. All skill levels are welcome and the tours are led by experienced, knowledgeable guides. They have a selection of tour options including private tours for your group.

Snowshoeing Tours

A snowshoeing tour is the perfect way to get outdoors and get some exercise without taking a chairlift! The **Aspen Center for Environmental Studies (ACES)** hosts snowshoeing tours daily at the top of Aspen Mountain. Experience gorgeous views while learning about the surrounding mountain ecology.

Many of us who call the mountains "home" say that we moved here for the winter and the skiing but stayed for the summer. (I feel this way!) The days are longer and brighter, the calendar is full of outdoor events and festivals, and the weather is close to perfect most of the time.

If outdoor dining is your thing, you'll love the al fresco options all over town. From casual pubs to fine dining restaurants, there are plenty of options to enjoy time with your friends over a bottle of wine and a meal outside.

Ride up the Gondolas

Both the Silver Queen gondola and Elk Camp gondola are open in the summer season for rides up the mountain. The mountain views are beautiful as you make your way to the top of either Aspen Mountain or Snowmass Mountain.

Once you're at the top you'll have photo opportunities, hiking trails, and a place to have lunch. Spend some time there and take in the fresh mountain air.

Sightseeing Pass: The sightseeing pass to go up the gondola to the top is \$35 per person. Free for kids 6 years old and under. These can be purchased online or at the ticket window. (subject to change)

Hiking

Getting outside for either a short, easy hike or a long, all-day hiking excursion is a great way to take full advantage of our 300+ days of Colorado sun!

Here are my favorite places to go for a hike in Aspen Snowmass:

Smuggler Mountain Trail

Smuggler Mountain Trail is easy to get to in the town of Aspen and has stunning views from the top! This trail is very popular so its best to start early. Round trip is approximately 3 miles and relatively easy after a bit of a climb at the start. Take your time and enjoy the views! It's a great way to start the day.

Rim Trail

Located in the Snowmass Village area is another one of my favorites – the Rim Trail. This is a moderate hike on a dirt trail with views of the Maroon Bells Wilderness and the Valley. The trail winds its way down (or up, depending on what you choose) from the Snowmass Mall to the Snowmass Recreation Center.

Camping

Maroon Creek

Camping in the Maroon Creek area is the most scenic and easy to get to in Aspen Snowmass. Reservations are recommended here as they fill up quickly because of their access to the Maroon Bells, a very beautiful and popular natural space. **You can make your reservations here**.

Difficult Campground, East of Aspen

Difficult Campground sits approximately 5 miles southeast of Aspen, Colorado next to the Roaring Fork River on the western slope of the Colorado Rockies. Campsites are located inside the forest and are an ideal setting for a nice, gorgeous camping excursion just outside of Aspen!

Biking along the Rio Grande Trail

For a refreshing and relaxing way to explore Aspen, rent cruiser bikes!


